There will be an Extraordinary General Meeting of the 'A' Field Battery Association Inc, and it is to be held at the Event Centre, Caloundra on the 27th May 2017, starting at 1000hrs. Items to be discussed are the change to the Constitution on membership.

Rule 4.

Classes of Membership;

(1) The membership of the association shall consist of any of the following classes of members:

Rule 4 (1) (a) Ordinary Member and Rule 4 (1) (e) are to be amended if approved by this meeting.

The reason for these amendments is to try and increase our membership and to improve the involvement in the running of the Association, as the Committee at present are all over seventy years old.

There must be double the Committee plus one to have these amendments approved, so please try to attend this important meeting.

Existing Rule 4 (1) (a) reads; ORDINARY MEMBER – Ordinary Membership shall only be available to a person who has served in 'A' Field Battery RRAA, who makes written application, pays the annual membership subscription fee and is accepted by the committee of management. A membership badge shall be issued in the first year.

New Rule 4 (1) (a); Ordinary Member – Ordinary Membership shall be to a person who has served in 'A' Field Battery RRAA and to immediate relatives of ex and serving members of 'A' Field Battery RRAA, who makes written application, pays the annual membership subscription fee and is accepted by the committee of management. A membership badge shall be issued in the first year.

Existing Rule 4 (1) (e): Associate Membership – Is offered to any member of the Corps of the Royal Regiment of Australian Artillery.

New Rule 4 (1) (e): Associate Membership – Associate Membership shall be available to anyone who is interested in preserving the history of 'A' Field Battery RRAA, which was raised on the 1st August 1871 as part of the N.S.W. regular defences, and is still serving as part of the Australian Regular Army.



Accommodation Building

The MWCCCC is a single story building with wheelchair access. All rooms have individual air-conditioned and own ceiling fans. We can accommodate up to 128 people with 64 rooms in total. 49 rooms of 2 single beds and private ensuite, 15 double rooms spread throughout site with 1 double bed and private ensuite. The Conference Centre/Dining Room can seat 180 people and also contains a commercial kitchen area.



The march in Sydney was well attended with marchers from several different generations of ex-A Fd Bty members. As the weather turned out to be fine, there was also a good spectator turnout. We had a new banner with a lightweight metal frame which was easy to transport and assemble, and made it easier for the young ladies from the St. George District Cadet Unit to carry. There was a minor mishap when one section of the banner pole collapsed during the march but due to its light weight, the carrier was able to hold it upright for the duration. I will make sure in future to instruct the girls how to fix it on the fly in case it happens again. The collapse was not the fault of the poles, it was just the way they were gripped and twisted. A little knowledge of this would have prevented the collapse. Our two banner carriers, Cadet Lance Corporal Nazarova and cadet Papagelis deserve special mention for the sterling job they did especially in the face of unfamiliar problems with the banner poles. They are a credit to themselves, their school and their instructors.
