

#### President's Report.

#### 1. Season's Greetings.

Hello, everybody. Firstly, at this time of the year I would like to wish everyone a peaceful and enjoyable Christmas and a happy, healthy and prosperous New year. Secondly, I have to applaud those people who took the time out of their busy schedules to send me some feedback on the last newsletter. It was all gratefully received, and we even had a few updates and corrections to include in this one. I hope I have successfully managed that to your satisfaction. But if you find anything else that needs fixing let me know and we'll do our best to fix it.

#### 2. Going National.

Since the last newsletter, I have had a conversation with Rebecca Barber, a solicitor working with a group called "Justice Connect" who provide a free legal advice service for charities and not-for-profit organisations like ours. The topic of discussion was "How do we best manage our transition from state-based to national organisation?". The reason this may become an important issue is that as we are incorporated in QLD and subject to their legislation, the position of secretary is restricted to QLD residents (or those who live within 65 km of the border). I suspect this last limit was put in to allow QLD police to do a hot pursuit across the border if the secretary decided to abscond with all the money. I can think of no other reason, and QLD appears to be the only state with this restriction.

The various options we have were outlined by Rebecca and we discussed the pro's and con's of each of them. While they can provide advice, they can not tell us which is the best one for us. That decision is still up to the membership to decide. However, each of the options are now clarified and can be presented to you in a format that we non-legally trained people (or me at least) can understand. I wil list them here.

- a) Do nothing and maintain the status quo. This will work until we need to elect a new secretary. If no QLD residents run for the position, the association will have to fold. This option doesn't give any security into the future. To their credit, I am given to understand that the QLD Department of Fair Trading would rather give instructions than fines for any documentary misdemeanours.
- b) Become a Company Limited by Guarantee (CLG). This option is mainly for profit-based groups or those with a regular financial turnover. There is a considerable ongoing cost to maintain our status as a CLG and a lot more scrutiny by ASIC. Financial penalties for incorrect or late lodgement of documents etc. are also rather steep.
- c) Become a Registered Australian Body. This is very similar to the previous option but is mostly for not-for-profit groups. According to Rebecca, it is a little-known option but ASIC do have a written procedure for making the transition to an RAB. The advantage is there is no restriction on where the office-holders must reside (except it must be in Australia). That only excludes about 3 of our members, sorry fellas, its the best we can do.

Between Rebecca and myself, we both agree that option C) is probably the way to go. I still have to read the ASIC document in depth and contact the ATO to sort out that side of things but I don't foresee any major dramas there. And we have until the next AGM to sort it out properly. I will write up a finalised plan of action to include in a newsletter before the AGM so that all our members can have some input into the decision.

#### 3) Special Project.

On Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> November I made a trip to Waverley cemetery to get some "before" photos and work out what may need to be done. I will also liaise with the family members in case they want to have an input as to what and how we do the work. The cemetery people have been very proactive in assisting us. Apparently they had approached the Australian War Graves Commission some time ago to help refurbish the grave and they were refused. This may have been because the AWGC only deal with war graves and monuments, and because Henry Green's is not strictly speaking a "war" grave it falls outside their purview. Either way, our effort is a timely one and is sure to be welcomed by the cemetery management and the Green family.

#### 4) 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.

I wrote a letter to the Minister for Defence notifying her of our association's existence, and also that our membership would appreciate being involved in the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary events if possible. That letter has been forwarded on to the minister for Veterans' Affairs, the Hon. Darren Chester. I am still awaiting a reply from him, however I did get an email from Major Gary Down, SO2 Head of Regiment RAA . He is part of a sub-committee looking into the 150<sup>th</sup> and planning the events. Here is a small excerpt from his email.

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Good morning Robert,

I have recently been reading the Oct 19 edition of the A Fd Bty Assn National Newsletter and noticed the section "150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary". The planning for this significant Australian Artillery anniversary is something that the Head of Regiment staff and a recently established sub-committee of the Regimental Committee are now actively involved in and indeed leading.

I also note that you intend to explore the possibility of a commemorative stamp and/or coins. Could I please ask that you keep the HOR staff abreast of any developments in this area as we must maintain an all-informed net regarding 150<sup>th</sup> initiatives in order to ensure that we do not replicate effort.

For your information, I have attached an advertisement that will appear in the next edition of the RAA Liaison Letter that covers the outline plans.


