#### President's Report.

Greetings one and all, and welcome to the new year. The past one was one I am sure most of us would rather forget. It has made us rethink what we took for granted in life and tried to adapt to the current way of things. There are some good things to report in this newsletter and some not so good as well. I will get the latter out of the way first. I received the following email from Phill Adams, the youngest son of David Adams, on the 19<sup>th</sup> January.

Good morning Gents, my name is Phill Adams , David's youngest son, sadly David passed away last Saturday 16 January after several weeks of illness, his funeral service will be at Norwood Crematorium Mitchell ACT at 1030 am, Monday 25 January 2021. David was our ACT liaison officer of only several months standing. A sad loss for his family and for those of us who served with him. A wreath was sent to the funeral on behalf of the Association. And now on with the rest of the news.

#### 1) 2020 AGM.

Our 2020 AGM was held on the 9<sup>th</sup> December 2020 using a combination of traditional and modern communications facilities. Due to the covid-19 situation, it was not possible for a major gathering of members at any one place to occur, so as well as having a Zoom electronic media setup we also had a small socially-distanced gathering of members at my residence. In all, there were enough for a quorum and the meeting went ahead with not too much trouble.

The election of office-holders in the Association occurred as I had outlined in the previous newsletter, that is, all current committee members were elected unopposed for the next year. Ample notice was given for others to nominate for any position and since none were forthcoming, and there were no objections, we were all re-elected. I thank the membership for their continuing confidence in our stewardship of the Association and we will be giving it our best shot for the coming year at least.

Murphy's Law struck with at least one of the Zoom attendees, Peter Kimball, whose internet went down at exactly the wrong moment and he had to ring in to continue his attendance. ### 2) 2021 AGM.


#### 5) Going National.

#### 6) Other News.

An enquiry by Mrs. June Duggan was made to Tex regarding the restoration of a 25 pounder in a park in Coonabarabran which is in desperate need of refurbishment. I spoke to Graham Hampton from the Royal Australian Artillery Historical Society to see if they are aware of any organisations that could do refurbishment work on the particular gun she was concerned about. He tells me that there are no such groups that he knows of in Australia, and that she should perhaps write to the local council to see if they can do the work since it belongs to them and it is in their park.

R. F. "Dodger" Noonan President 'A' Fd Bty Association Inc. <u>Captain Cavalie Mercer</u> <u>Troop Commander</u> <u>G Troop – Royal Horse Artillery</u> <u>in</u> <u>The Battle of Waterloo</u>



A British Troop of guns in the battle of Waterloo was commanded by a Captain Cavalie Mercer. G Troop, Royal Horse Artillery, consisted of five (5) 6 pounder field pieces and one (1) howitzer. The men were well trained and the Troop was well provisioned with ammunition.

G Troop was on the extreme right flank of Wellington's army and because of changes in the battle, the Troop was moved to the centre of the line, where there was heavy fighting. G Troop was very vulnerable, however there was an infantry square close at hand the Troop could escape too.

French Heavy Cavalry of Napoleon's Imperial Guard began to position for an attack on the guns. Wellington sent an aide to inform Captain Mercer to move his horses and men into the infantry square for protection. *Mercer refused to leave his guns and instantly decided to stand and fight*. At 1515 hours on 18 June 1815 a division of French Imperial Cavalry attacked and the gunners retaliated with heavy fire from all guns. When the cavalry failed, Napoleon ordered his Grenadiers of the Imperial Guard to attack. Again the gunners stood firm and opened fire with case-shot at close range, causing heavy casualties among the French Grenadiers. Napoleon was incensed with the failure of the cavalry and grenadiers. He ordered his Curassiers to attack the guns. Mercer waited until they were within 50 metres and opened fire. Mercer was prepared for all charges and this time he double-loaded his guns with case-shot over ball. When the guns fired the whole front rank of Curassiers fell from the case-shot and the ball that followed took out the following ranks.

The ground became impassable with the French dead and wounded men and the multitude of horses. It was not possible to launch any more assaults on the gun position.

Remarkably, G Troop only had 5 men killed and 15 wounded, and he lost 69 horses in the fight. G Troop fired 700 rounds of ammunition in that short afternoon engagement. Although Mercer and his gunners stood their ground, Wellington was not happy with him disobeying orders, and it was some considerable time before Mercer was promoted.
